These offerings will be collected beginning October 4. Last year, it took Calvary until January to meet our goal. Let's be committed to wrapping up this year's offering by November 29.

On Sunday, November 1, Mr. Blake Ragsdale, who is a communications associate for the Baptist Children's Homes, will be delivering the message in both of our services.
